PREVIEW OF THE AREA COMMITTEE MEETING

February 2013

First of all, I would like to thank everyone who attended the January ACM. We had such a great feeling seeing so many willing people serving as a part of Panel 63. We have never been so excited to run out of available seats!

At last month's meeting, we began by introducing ourselves to a whole room full of new GSRs, DCMs, DCMCs, standing committee members, and others. The ACM passed two housekeeping motions: the first was the CNCA 2013 proposed budget, and the second was the approval of a letter of support to PENYPAA 2014. Next, we passed an assembly bid for District 14 to host the 2014 Post-Conference Assembly in May. We would like to thank District 08 Contra Costa for making themselves available to publish the CNCA Comments for this Panel.

I just wanted to clarify for you the motions that are found in the CNCA Comments. There are two very similar motions coming from the Web Committee, but with a very different significance. The first is a motion to the ACM, which will be discussed next month as old business. It is "That the motion passed to receive the CNCA Comments via email be rescinded [1105-1]." The second motion is an Assembly motion, and it will be presented as a new business at the Pre-Conference Assembly, "That CNCA cease production, copying and mailing of hardcopy versions of CNCA Comments/Comentarios except when individually requested."

There will also be old business at the Pre-Conference Assembly, "That Area Officer travel to each district be limited to twice per year, unless otherwise requested by the district."

I'm very excited about the upcoming Pre-Conference Assembly on April 6-7 at the Contra Costa Fairgrounds. *Please bring your FM radios.* **"Why Do We Need a Conference?"** Recently I had an experience sharing with a newcomer that had just left the hospital in search of a meeting. His arms were bruised and bandaged from IVs. He had found us by calling the directory, reminding me how important General Service is. I thought of the words of the late Bernard B. Smith in the AA Service Manual - "We may not need a General Service Conference to ensure our own recovery. We do need it to ensure the recovery of the alcoholic who still stumbles in the darkness one short block from this room." (S20)

When discussing the Agenda Topics in our groups, I found it important to consider the Principle of the Sharing Session. "To allow everyone that cares to, the opportunity to share experiences, ideas and hopes for A.A.s' future." I have discovered on my district visits throughout our area, that CNCA is rich in its diversity of experiences and points of view. It's of greater importance that I hear about the Why or Why Not, on a particular agenda item, not just about a tally of members' pro/con.
