(Yes, there are different expenses for odd/even years)Q: Delegate expenses between 24-34 it appears that some items are missing. Will this effect budget? / There are some missing numbers after line 31: missing is postage, delegate expenses, Jeff will email corrected budget copies to all DCMCs / Q. p1 line 115 - difference between budget for 2012 and 2013 has doubled. Why? (Crescent City)/(Discussion of

different line items: Line 29; / Line 30 phone / Line 32 agenda topic background / Line 35 conference expense Line 36 total delegate conf expenses; Great Job Finance committee and helper, Oliver G..

Discussion: We have no bid for CNCA comments. Call for sharing. / Although not an editor, working on comments got me and other people in district into service who has continued on. It is a wonderful unifying experience. Dist 12 did comments a few years ago and echoed sentiments.

PRESENTATION OF NEW BUSINESS:

MOTION:

That the motion passed at the May 2011 Area Committee Meeting to allow for the option of receiving the CNCA Comments via email [1105-1] be rescinded.—Web committee

QUESTIONS: Why? Does anyone have an answer? (It seemed to get in the way of our process of getting a pdf on the website so it seemed to be redundant, a massive undertaking that is unnecessary) / (This removes a burden from the registrar. Q: isn't the email version protected? (Nothing was implemented).Q: as an archivist I see motions and I don't know what happened? It might be helpful to have it there to record. Q: we will be voting at assembly to stop physically mailing comments. What worries me is we are going to a situation where people must change how they receive their comments. I think it would be better to gradually adapt. Q: Anonymity may hurt us; what we are trying to accomplish? What about the half who do not own computers? Q. Computer security: we have to sanitize the comments. The danger means the registrar would have to sanitize and have a great deal of work. Q. Neither of these motions precludes anyone's receiving a hard copy, an individual may opt out. Q. Seems like these motions appeared at the same time and this pdf posting seemed to be a better choice to avoid massive emails. That motion has been placed on a back burner and I'm wondering if that motion should be closed. Q. Recommen-

dations are still in hands of committee and additional action would be needed to establish a procedure to email comments. Q. Why is Oct the only one posted? (Sanitization discovered a snafu and communication was slow).

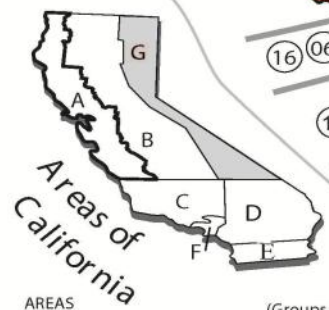

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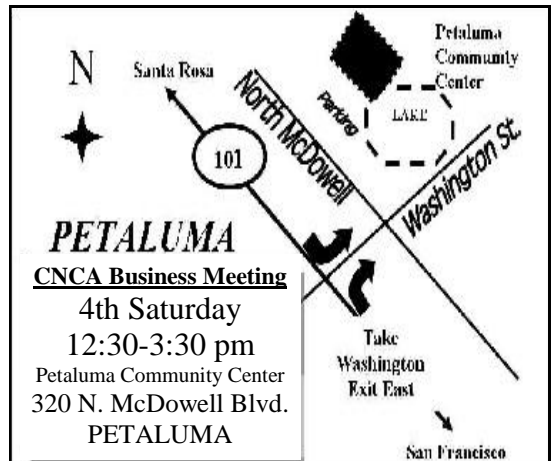
